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Overall Feedback Report by IQAC 2020-21

V T B College has a comprehensive feedback mechanism in place to collect feedback from various stakeholders, including students, teachers and alumni. This feedback is used to identify areas of strength and weakness and develop an action plan for future improvement.

Feedback Mechanism

Feedback collection: The feedback on Curriculum and Academic Ambience is collected from various stake holders like students, alumni, teachers at the end of every year as part of the quality initiative of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College. IQAC with the help of feedback committee drafts a questionnaire comprising questions on curriculum and academic performance, ambience, and overall satisfaction on a 5-point scale. Adequate changes will be made, if required, in the questionnaire every year as per need. The questionnaire is finalized and approved by the IQAC and used for data collection from stake holders. Data is collected using either offline or online using Google Forms from the stakeholders.

Feedback Analysis: The feedback collected from various stakeholders is analysed by the IQAC and overall feedback is consolidated. IQAC also prepares feedback, which is intimated to the respective authorities for further action.

Action Plan: The institute analyse the feedback and take various actions in light of the feedback received. This may include suggestions to make changes to curriculum, teaching methods, or infrastructure. The Action Taken Report from each department is communicated to IQAC. The IQAC consolidates all the action taken reports and prepares the institutional action taken report for the feedback of the respective year. This report is submitted to the appropriate bodies, such as the university and the governing body. The feedback analysis and action taken report are communicated to the stakeholders through various channels, such as the college website, email, and notice boards.

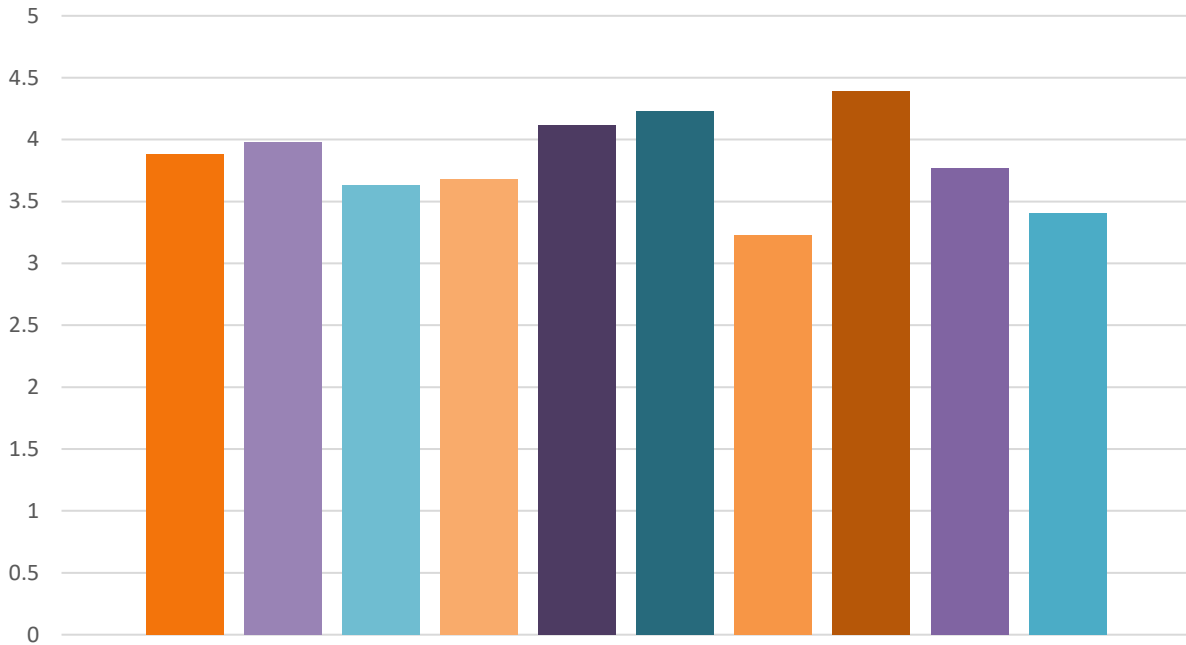
Target Group – Students

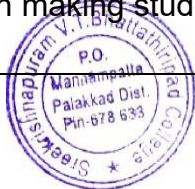

5. The syllabus coverage and promptness of valuation and publication of results of internals have good score.
6. The learning resources like library ICT provisions has improved.
7. There is a need to incorporate components to enhance entrepreneurial skills among students.
8. Initiatives taken to bridge the gap between industry and academia is less.

From Alumni Feedback Analysis

1. Syllabus need to be changed as per the requirement of the industry.
2. Needs to introduce contents in the syllabus that helps in professional development.
3. The curriculum lacks elements to develop presentation skills and ability to work in teams.
4. Needs to improve entrepreneurial skills through the syllabus
