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Indian Knowledge System (IKS)

The institution established a centre in 2019 specifically for the Indian Knowledge System and Indigenous culture and knowledge, named Vaikhari (वेंदरी): Centre for Research in Kerala Heritage. The centre focuses on research, preservation, education, publication, and archiving. It engages in research and documentation, preservation, education and outreach, collaboration, publication, and archiving of Kerala's diverse cultural practices, traditions, art forms, architecture, and historical narratives. The centre collaborates with various cultural institutions in Kerala, and several departments of VTB College are involved in its work. The college also conducted a UGC STRIDE Component 1 project on "Vedic Education System in Kerala - A Comprehensive, Scientific, Interdisciplinary Analysis." The project included five minor research studies within the Indian Knowledge System, exploring various aspects such as the Vedic oral tradition, its preservation, transmission, and unique characteristics. They are as follows:

- Philosophy of Education in the Vedic Education System of Kerala A Comprehensive Analysis
- Survey on the Present Vedic Education System in Kerala
- Holistic Development of Students in Vedic Education System in Kerala: An Experimental Analysis
- A Case Study based on the Vedic Education System of Kerala

In addition to the research projects, UGC STRIDE Component 1 encompasses five academic programs and eleven other activities, including seminars, workshops, and conferences related to the Indian Knowledge System.




1. National Seminar on Manuscripts of Scientific Literature in Sanskrit

Report

An International Conference on the Philosophy of Education in India through Ages – From Prehistoric to Present Time was conducted by the **UGC STRIDE Component 1** project on 27th, 28th February, and 1st March 2023. The conference was inaugurated by Dr. Jayaraj M. K., Vice Chancellor of the University of Calicut. Prof. Sanjay Sonawane, Pro-Vice Chancellor of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune (SPPU), delivered the keynote address. Dr. Asmund Aamas, Associate Professor, Faculty of Humanities, Sports and Educational Science, Department of Culture, Religion and Social Studies, University of South Eastern Norway, dealt with "Culture, Philosophy, and Education." The first technical session on the topic "Language and Philosophy in India - From Ancient Bharat to Present" was handled by Dr. P. C. Muraleemadhavan, Head of the Department of Sahitya (Retd), Central Sanskrit University, Guruvayoor Campus. Dr. Vaibhav Jadahav, from the School of Open Learning and Coordinator of the School of Education, SSPU, delivered a session on how Indian languages have influenced education from ancient times to the present. Report

The program organized by STRIDE Component 1, focusing on the salient features of oral traditions within the Vedic education system, was a short-term course titled *Oral Traditions of Vedic Education – Structural and Phonetic Perspectives*. It was held from 9th to 18th August 2021 via the Zoom platform. The program was conducted in collaboration with the Department of Sanskrit. Dr. Kesavan Veluthattu delivered the inaugural speech, introducing Vedic literature and the history of the Vedic education system. The course focused on the structural and phonetic perspectives of the oral traditions of the Vedic education system. It covered the chanting traditions and structural analysis of the Rgveda, Yajurveda, and Sāmaveda, while only a structural analysis was conducted for the Atharvaveda.







About The College and UGC STRIDE Component 1

Sreekrishnapuram V. T. Bhattathiripad College is a government aided arts and science college in Palakkad district of Kerala affiliated to the University of Calicut. In the year 2019 the college got approval from UGC to execute an interdisciplinary research project under scheme of UGC STRIDE Component 1 on the topic **Vedic Education System in Kerala** - **A Comprehensive Scientific and** Interdisciplinary Analysis.

Aim of The Course

Vedas are learned through the chanting tradition of oral transmission and that's how the name sruti came in to being. Kerala followed a unique and systematic method of Vedic teaching and learning system in several aspects.



Among them the pronunciation of syllables with the application of phonetic rules and the usage of accent system through the Hastamudras are played a vital role in preserving Vedic studies. Vedic phonetics, (mainly examined by the Siksas and Pratisakhyas) is an area of science which explored a vast area of knowledge on the sound production and articulation. In Kerala, Tamil chanting traditions are also living with some awesome peculiarities in its structure and content.

The course aims to explore the salient features and significance of chanting traditions of Kerala, to pave a path in the field of research to Vedic phonetics and its derivations in Indian linguistics and also to put forward the discourses in the Tamil traditions living in Kerala which are not much poured. This course is meant to promote and motivate the institutions and students those who are teaching and learning the Vedas traditionally.

Outcome	In corpus, the conference produced uncountable data on the field of ancient Indian Astronomy and Mathematics and shed a great deal of light on the treatises and observations from Kerala.

Report

An International Conference on Ancient Indian Astronomy and Mathematics with Special Reference to Kerala was conducted by the UGC STRIDE Component 1 Project of the College from 26th to 28th July 2021, focusing on ancient Indian scientific approaches in depth. Indian astronomy and mathematics hold a significant place in the history of ancient India and explore the philosophical development within the world of mathematics. The contributions of Prof. K. V. Sarma were discussed in a panel led by Dr. S. A. S. Sharma from Pondicherry. The presenters examined the extensive literature on Indian scientific treatises and the meticulous work done by Prof. K. V. Sarma. Dr. Vrinda addressed the interpretation of the rule of circuit radios of the cyclic quadrilateral, and there were discussions on the textual aspects of Medieval Kerala. The presentation highlighted Kerala's contributions to mathematics.

Dr. Venkateswara Pai introduced the vast corpus of astronomical literature mentioned in the Siddhānta and Kāraṇa texts, which cover both theoretical and practical aspects of the subject. His topic focused on the Karaṇapaddhati of Putumana Somayaji, a text or manual for composing a Kāraṇa (practical) work. Prof. Satyanand Kichenassamy raised three questions addressing the significance of oral tradition. His presentation was on "Geometry without Figures: Mathematics as Apodictic Discourse in Indian Texts." The conference generated a wealth of data on ancient Indian astronomy and mathematics, shedding significant light on the treatises and observations from Kerala.

Report

On 25th and 26th June 2021, the core committee inaugurated the preparatory work for historical analysis through a two-day national-level seminar on *The Vedic Education System and Literature – Historical Analysis*. The collaborating agency was the Department of History, Sreekrishnapuram V. T. Bhattathiripad College. Dr. V. V. Haridas, the inaugural speaker, addressed the perspectives on the transition of the Vedic period. Dr. N. K. Sundareswaran delivered the keynote address on Vedic literature and the education system in general. He specifically highlighted the fourfold division of the Vedas: Saṃhitā, Āraṇyaka, Brāhmaṇa, and Upaniṣad, along with the ceremonial observations and occupations described in Vedic literature. Dr. Nirmala Kulkarni critiqued the position of women in Vedic literature. Dr. Malavika Binny discussed the systematic approaches of ancient Indian scientific branches and the exchange of methods with Western countries that ruled India for a long time. The seminar successfully illuminated the historical background of the Vedic education system, which is based on oral tradition.
