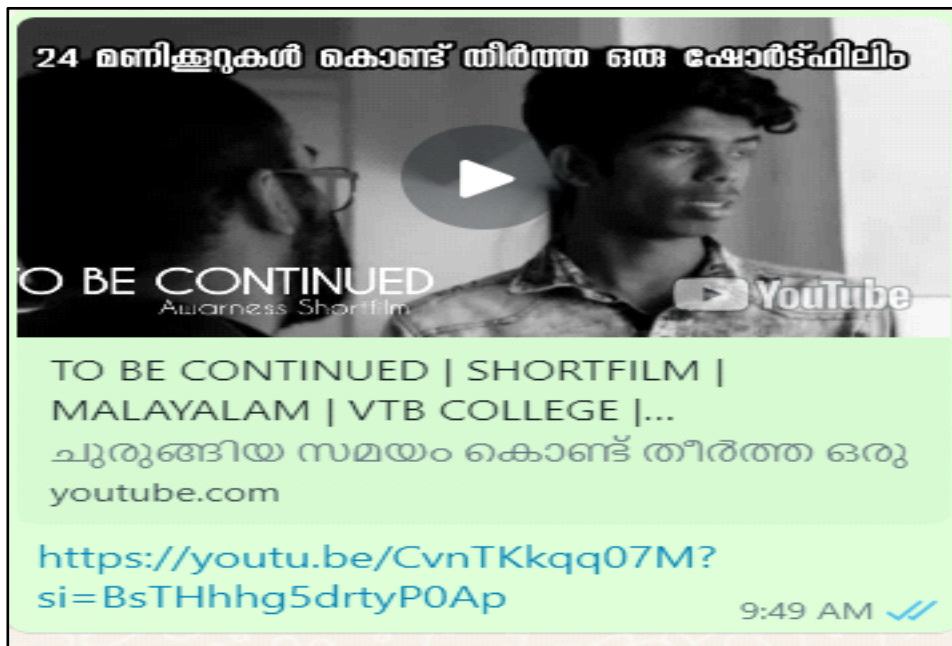

Urava - Watershed Management and Preservation of Water Sources

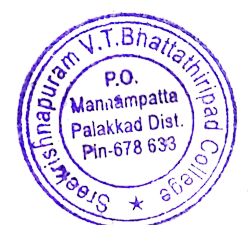

For making students aware of watershed management, an awareness class is conducted in November 2019 by Dr. Ravishankar, VEO and trainer in Watershed management.



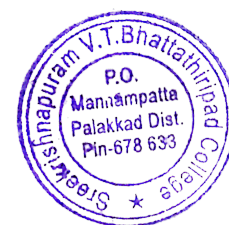
