

II. Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

The Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is central to the National Education Policy 2020. Our college, affiliated with the University of Calicut, follows the Credit and Semester System (CBCSS) as per university guidelines. This system assigns credits based on instructional hours and allows for continuous assessment through internal evaluations and end-semester exams. It also offers flexibility for students to choose electives and tailor their education.

Starting this academic year, we will adopt ABC and register students in the National Academic Depository in alignment with the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP). The University Grants Commission's ABC allows credit transfer among institutions, enabling students to take up to one course per semester from other colleges, with a maximum of four courses (16 credits) in four years. Students discontinuing before three years will receive a "Courses cum Credits Certificate" for future re-entry. Additionally, a DIGILOCKER system will be established to manage these credits.

III. Skill Development

In pursuit of the holistic development of our students, the College places great emphasis on skill development to equip them for success in their future careers. Our institution ensures that students actively engage in various programs like the Additional Skill Acquisition Program (ASAP), Work Readiness Program, and Walk With a Scholar Program (WWS).








Short Term course on Oral Traditions of Vedic Education – Structural and Phonetic Perspectives



Three-day International conference on Philosophy of Education in India through ages from prehistoric to present












Outreach Programme - Gitavani

V. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE)

The institution prioritizes Outcome Based Education (OBE), with the college's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organizing various programs, including a 'One Day Workshop on Introduction to Outcome Based Education'. 
Duty Certificates for Faculties Attending OBE Training Programme


National Integration


