## Profile of the College

#### Sree Sankara Trust

Sree Sankara Trust was established in 1965 in Peringara, Kerala, by a group of well-wishers from the Namboothiri community, led by founder Chairman Sri P.N. Namboothiri. It is registered under the Literary, Scientific, and Charitable Societies Registration Act of 1955.

The Trust is dedicated to the ideals and philosophies of Jagadguru Sree Sankaracharya, the renowned Indian saint and proponent of the Advaita Philosophy. Its mission is to realign educational and social welfare activities, encouraging the youth of the country to embrace progressive values for a healthy and productive life.

#### **Educational Institutions under the Trust**

The Trust's first educational institution, Sree Sankara Vidyapeedam College (Government Aided), was established in Perumbavoor near Kalady, the birthplace of Sree Sankaracharya. The second college, Sreekrishnapuram V. T. Bhathathirippad College (Government Aided), in Palakkad District, is named after the esteemed social reformer and writer V.T. Bhattathiripad. This college is affiliated with the University of Calicut and also provides education up to the postgraduate level.

The third institution, another Sree Sankara Vidyapeetom College, is located in the picturesque Nagaroor valleys of Thiruvananthapuram District.

Sree Sankara College (Government Aided) in Nagaroor, the fourth institution established by the Sree Sankara Trust, was founded in 2018. Affiliated with the University of Kerala, SSC offers a range of undergraduate courses. The college is committed to providing quality education and fostering a supportive learning environment.

#### History of Sreekrishnapuram V T Bhattathiripad College

Sreekrishnapuram V. T. Bhattathiripad College, a first-grade Government Aided College, is affiliated with the University of Calicut. Established in 1982, the college serves the rural and backward regions of Sreekrishnapuram in the Palakkad district of Kerala. Named after V. T. Bhattathiripad, a pioneer of



social revolution in Kerala, the college aims to promote higher education. Managed by the Sree Sankara Trust.

The college began modestly as a junior college with two pre-degree Groups. In 1991, it was upgraded to a Degree college with the introduction of a B.A. in Sanskrit. Further advancements came in 2001 when it was elevated to a First-Grade college with the addition of an M.Sc. in Computer Science. Today, the college offers six Undergraduate Degree courses and three Postgraduate Degree courses.

In recognition of its quality and standards, the college is included under sections 12(B) and 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956, as per the letter No: F8-91/99(CP-P-1) dated 20-03-2000 from the Secretary of the UGC. The college was re-accredited with a B+ grade by NAAC in 2016.

The college's mission is to provide higher education opportunities to students in rural areas, fostering academic excellence and social responsibility. Through its dedication to these ideals, Sreekrishnapuram V. T. Bhattathiripad College continues to contribute significantly to the educational and social landscape of Kerala.

## Methodology of the Audit

A questionnaire is prepared for verification as per the current NAAC manual for assessment and accreditation framework. Data were collected from all teaching departments, administrative offices, NSS offices, student representatives from different clubs and college unions, Vaikhari Centre and V. T. Pathanakendram. After that, a meeting with IQAC and the heads of all departments was held, and the observation was finalized.



#### **Observation**

#### Curricular Aspects

- In the academic year 2023-24, the institution continued its obligation to enhance student learning by offering a diverse range of 16 courses, including certificate, diploma, and value-added programs.
- During this year, a significant 16 courses were attended by students, with 840 successfully completing them. This accounts for 84.33% of the student population benefiting from these programs.
- VTB College excels in integrating crosscutting issues of Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment, and Sustainability into its curriculum, reflecting a holistic commitment to nurturing responsible citizens.
- In 2023-24, 32.73% of students actively participated in project work, internships, and industrial visits, ensuring practical exposure and experiential learning opportunities.
- Human Rights principles are ingrained in the curriculum
- The *Vaikhari* Centre for Research in Kerala Heritage enhances the concepts of Kerala culture, fostering a deep appreciation for the values of our heritage.
- The institution instils community orientation through outreach programs, connecting students to real-world issues.
- The institution actively collects feedback from stakeholders, including students, teachers, and alumni and provides action-taken reports on its website.

## \* Teaching and Learning Aspects

- In the academic year, 87.77% of sanctioned Seats are filled, and 91.89% of Reserved seats are filled against the earmark.
- Approximately 91.43% of full-time teachers hold NET/SET/Ph.D. qualifications, underscoring the solid academic foundation of the faculty. The student-full-time-teacher ratio remained at 28.45 for the academic year.
- A total of 70.91% of the students qualified for the U.G. examination in the year, and P.G. results are yet to come.
- VTB College prioritizes student-centric and ICT-enabled learning experiences. This is evident through:
  - Student-centric methods: Samvada Kalari (Discussions and Debates), VTB Dharshan (Creating educational videos in Media Lab), One More Chance @VTB (Peer teaching), Nataka Kalari (Theatre workshops), Students' Seminars and Conferences, Roleplay, Skit, Internships, Exhibitions and Trade Fairs

- Effective ICT integration: Various instructional tools (G Suite, Google Classroom, Google Meet, Zoom, Prezi Video, WhatsApp and Telegram) and Assessment tools such as quizzes and Kahoot were used.
- Transparent and Efficient Internal Assessment System: Internal assessments follow University regulations and employ an Internal Examination Committee. The continuous assessment components, such as assignments, seminars, or Viva, are the responsibility of individual teachers. The internal marks are uploaded after the students check them, and grievances are redressed promptly.
- Outcome-Based Education (OBE) implementation: Programme Outcomes (P.O.s) and Course Outcomes (C.O.s) are communicated through the website, classrooms, and departments. In the evaluation system, P.O.s and Cos are identified through the question paper, and attainment is evaluated through EMBASE.

#### \* Research, Innovation and Extension

- VTB College demonstrates an intense commitment to research, innovation, and community engagement, establishing a comprehensive ecosystem for knowledge creation and dissemination.
- VTB College has fostered a thriving ecosystem for innovation and knowledge transfer through dedicated organizations like the IEDC, IIC, and E.D. Club.
- Vaikhari Centre for Research in Kerala Heritage actively promotes Indian Knowledge Systems.
- This year, the institution received grants totalling INR 30,000 for research-related activities.
- A total of 10 workshops, seminars, and conferences specifically in entrepreneurship, IPR and research methodology were conducted during the academic year.
- Faculty members published 10 research papers in journals on the UGC CARE list during the academic year.
- Faculty members contributed significantly to academia by publishing 7 books, chapters in edited volumes, and papers in national/international conference proceedings.
- The institution initiated 20 extension programmes through NSS, Staff Club, etc.
- The institution has received University and State level NSS Awards for Unit, Programme Officer and Volunteer. Various other awards and recognitions were received for the institution's impactful extension activities and its dedication to social responsibility.
- There are four new MoUs: collaborations/linkages for Faculty exchange, Student exchange, Internship, Field Project, On-the-job



training, research and other academic activities undertaken by the institution during the academic year.

#### **❖** Infrastructure

VTB College is geographically located in a rural area, nestled on top of a hill amidst 32 acres of lush greenery. The institution prioritizes infrastructure development guided by the directives of its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (1QAC).

#### • Academic Infrastructure:

- o In the academic year, 100% of the classrooms in the college are ICT enabled, with 19 LCD projectors for U.G. Classrooms and 6 Smart T.V.s for P.G. Classrooms.
- o The library has been fully automated after implementing a digital library, Remote access to Library resources and Web OPAC.
- Co-Curricular and Extracurricular Facilities:
  - o This year, the college added one open auditorium and a sound system for cultural activities.
  - o The sports facilities have also made a markable increase, which includes a football ground, practice ground, cricket net, chess corner, carroms corner, and renovated volleyball ground and multi gym.
  - o Constructed a Board room (Discussion room) for Dedicated spaces for Conferences and discussions.

#### I.T. Facilities:

- o Regularly updated desktops, laptops, and printers in all departments.
- o Campus network for seamless communication and data sharing.
- ERP purchased EMBASE ERP Solution provide facility for administration, Complaint Management, Finance and Accounts, Admission, Student Support, Outcome Based Education and Conduct of Examination
- Wi-Fi access across the campus with bandwidth upgrades in the year with 10 additional Wi-Fi routers
- o The student-computer ratio for the academic year 2023-24 was 1:15

### **Student support and Progression**

- Approximately 66.06% of students benefitted from scholarships and free ships, enhancing accessibility to education during the 2023-24 academic year.
- The students were provided with various opportunities to build their capacities. The institution has organised 2 ICT and computer-related training, 4 language and communication skill development classes, 6 life skill classes and one soft skill development class. This is a clear indication of the institution's focus on the skill development of the students.



- In 2023-24, 51.61% of students received valuable guidance for competitive examinations and career counselling, aiding in their academic and professional pursuits.
- VTB College already has a grievance mechanism, and it has been improved over the years. The online grievance submission facility was added in the year, and the time to redress the grievance is reduced through the improved mechanism.
- The placement and progression of students are not collected entirely because, at this time, the results of the U.G. programmes have just arrived, and the P.G. programmes are pending.
- Among the outgoing students, 5 students have qualified for state/national/international examinations.
- During the year, 11 medals were secured by the students for their outstanding performance in sports and arts.
- The number of sports and cultural programs in which students of the Institution participated during the year is 59.
- The Alumni Association recognizes academic and extracurricular excellence and financially supports meritorious students through scholarships.
- Alumni act as resource persons in workshops, conferences, and seminars and provide valuable feedback for development.

#### \* Professional Development Activities

VTB College demonstrates a comprehensive alignment between governance and its vision/ mission, fostering an atmosphere infused with values and cultural heritage. The institution effectively implements the National Education Policy (NEP). Decentralization is a cornerstone of governance, realized through various committees ensuring accountability.

#### • Strategic Alignment:

- VTB College's governance structure and decisions are guided by its vision and mission, which is evidenced in the NEP implementation, the orientation on IKS and the preparedness towards the implementation of NEP.
- In the academic year 2023-24, the faculty members of the college contributed significantly towards the implementation of NEP in the University of Calicut as the Board of Studies and the Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) curriculum development committee.
- o The college implements the strategic plan through a decentralized administration through diverse committees and adherence to regulations.
- Faculty Empowerment: A comprehensive performance appraisal system, effective welfare measures and career development opportunities promote staff efficiency and enthusiasm.

- Resource Mobilization: The institution dynamically tries to find funding from various sources and conducts internal and external audits in the year for transparency and accountability.
- E-Governance: In the year, the institution implemented e-governance in full fledge for various administrative and academic functions, enhancing efficiency and transparency.
- Financial Assistance to Faculty: 77.14% of the institution's faculty members were provided with financial support to attend conferences/workshops and towards membership fees of professional bodies.
- Professional Development/Administrative training: 91.43% of the teachers in the college had attended FDP, MDP, and Professional Development/Administrative training programs during the year. 75% of the non-teaching staff of the college participated in some professional development/ administrative training programme during the year.
- IQAC ensures the institute's participation in all quality enhancement efforts of the central government and the Ministry of Higher Education. The college participated in web-based All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) and started participating in NIRF.

#### \* Institutional Values and Best Practices

- VTB College has demonstrated a vigorous assurance of gender equity through a comprehensive Gender Audit process. In 2023-24, the gender audit report reflects the role of women is well placed in the institution.
- The college's proactive "Gender Policy" was amended in the year, and it permeates all activities, fostering an environment that discourages discrimination and harassment.
- The Women's Development Cell has played a pivotal role in organizing various awareness programs and integrating gender sensitization into curricular and co-curricular activities. Moreover, the institution has arranged amenities for women and implemented stern security measures. The institution also has an active Internal Compliant Committee.
- The college's Green policy reflects a commitment to mitigating its environmental impact, which is evident through various initiatives like green audits, energy audits, and sustainability programs.
- VTB College actively promotes diversity across cultural, regional, linguistic, and socioeconomic dimensions. The college organises co-curricular programmes for inclusivity through various clubs and NSS.
- Best practices highlight the institution's commitment to Indigenous Cultural heritage, environment sustainability and social welfare.
- *Vaikhari* Centre for Research in Kerala Heritage has actively conducted programmes on the Indian Knowledge system and Kerala cultural heritage even after completing the UGC STRIDE project.



- *Spandanam* An initiative of social welfare and Sustainability: The programme positively impacted society and the environment, fostering responsible citizens who contribute to sustainable development.
- V T Padhanakendram is a distinctive programme that studies social transformations by focusing on V.T. Bhattathiripad's contributions to social reform and education and women's empowerment.

## **Summary of Audit Report**

Consolidated reports from all stakeholders have strengthened the institution's feedback system. Outcome-Based Education (OBE) has been implemented successfully, including OBE-based evaluation. Academic infrastructure, co-curricular and extracurricular facilities, and I.T. facilities have increased significantly this year, and the institution has achieved 100% ICT-enabled classrooms. Scholarship and capacity-building initiatives are strong; however, progression and placement data have not been completely collected due to pending results at the time of the audit. Faculty empowerment programs and support from the institution are up to the mark. The college's adherence to institutional values and best practices is evident in its multifaceted approach to gender equity, inclusivity, documentation, preservation, dissemination, and extension of Kerala heritage, environmental sustainability, and social commitment.

#### Recommendations

- ✓ Actively seek additional research grants to support ongoing research initiatives and facilitate more research projects.
- ✓ Continue pursuing collaborations, MoUs, and linkages for faculty and student exchange, internships, and research activities.
- ✓ Review the attainment of strategic goals and Make a case study on strategic plan deployment.
- ✓ Enhance the activities of *Vaikhari* Centre for Research in Kerala Heritage by creating linkages with National and international organisations with similar vision.
- ✓ Develop a start-up or incubation centre to promote innovation through Institutional Innovation Council.
