Report

As a part of Golden jubilee celebration of Calicut University, the NSS department was directed to build home for the homeless, which was titled as 'Abhayam' project. We constructed two houses for Abhayam.

Mythree Bhavan

Ganga A, D/O Kunhunni, Azhikkattil Veeramangalam was the first beneficiary of Abhayam. She was the final year History student of our college. She came from a poor background and her family included father, mother and four girl children. Her mother faced mental problems. They lived in a dilapidated shed covered with Tarpolin. We visited the family and realized the situation on 2 nd October 2017. We contacted the Ward member — Smt. Geetha and Sri K K Narayanan Kutty, the Panchayath President of Trikkadeeri. Later, the plight of this family was discussed in the advisory body of our college and we decided to go forward with the construction. We gave the name MYTHREE BHAVAN for Abhayam. The measurement of this house is 650 sq. feet and an estimate of 8 Lakhs of rupees was decided for its construction.

Foundation Work

The foundation stone was laid by the Panchayath President Sri. K.K. Narayanankutty on 26 th January 2018. Dr. E. Jayan Principal of our college, Prof. Narayanan Namboothiri, Ward members Smt. Geetha, Sri. Sankaranarayanan, Sri. Prakashan, etc participated. The Programme Officers and 150 volunteers were present in this occasion.

Then the work started smoothly. The NSS Volunteers collected money through coupon and they halped in work. Major part of the foundation work was done by our volunteers

and was completed on 1/3/2018. The Belt concrete was on 15 March 2018. Rs. 1.25 lakh was spent so far.

Wall Construction

In April first week we started the work of wall and completed it on 30/5/2018. One lakh rupee was spent for wall construction.76000 rupees for windows and Katila, Lintel & Sunshade Concrete. The lintel and sunshade concrete were on 6/6/2018. Rs.75000 was spent for this.

The fund was collected from teachers, students and also outside college. Further progress of 'Abhayam' was obstructed by the flood in Kerala.

Main Concrete

After the flood relief activities, we got engaged the next work of Mythree Bhavan. From the help of Management and PTA we continued the work. The main concrete was on 16/9/2018. Rs. 1.25 lakh was spent for main concrete.

Plastering Work

Before plastering the electrical work was completed. Then plastering work was started on 2nd March 2019 and completed on 25 March. The expenditure was 1,65000 Rs. Then the finishing work including bathroom work, doors, floor etc were done in June and spent 1,35000 lakhs rupees.

The work of Mythree Bhavan was completed and the Key handover ceremony was conducted on 29 June 2019 Saturday.

Abhayam

AKKI A Ambazhakkode, Pulimundakunnu, Kandamangalam was another beneficiary of Abhayam connected to Panchayath. She was a widow and belonged to a poor family. Kottoppadam Gramapanchayath requested the help of NSS to complete the work of their house. As per the request of Panchayath the NSS units of our college undertook the responsibility of that house.

The NSS volunteers collected money from Kottoppadam, Kandamangalam, Ariyoor etc. The measurement of the house is 600 sq feet. The wall construction was not completed ,we continued the work. The main concrete was on 1 April 2018. We spent 1,00000 lakh rupees for concrete, and 60000 thousand rupees for windows and Katila.

Then the plastering work was completed on 15 th May 2019. The expenditure was 1,00000 rupees. The finishing works such as floor, door, painting etc were completed on 15 th June 2019. The expenditure was 1,40000 lakhs of rupees. The NSS volunteers actively participated for the work of Abhayam. The key handover ceremony was conducted on 29 June 2019 Saturday. The total expenditure of Mythree Bhavan was 8,01000 lakhs of rupees. The total expenditure of Abhayam was 4,00000 lakhs of rupees.

Key Handover Ceremony

The key handover ceremony of Mythree and Abhayam was conducted on 29 June 2019. Sree Sankara Trust Secretary Prof. S. Krishnan inaugurated the function.

The NSS Co Ordinator of Calicut University Sri. P. Valsaraj was our Chief guest. Dr. E Jayan our respected principal handed over the key to Mythree- Abhayam Beneficiaries. The Panchayath representatives, the programme officers, and hundreds of NSS volunteers and other natives were presented here. The staff and students of our college provided furniture and other materials to the Mythree Abhayam beneficiaries.

Conclusion:

The "Abhayam" project exemplifies the college's dedication to social and economic inclusiveness. By providing shelter for homeless individuals, the project addresses a critical social issue while promoting community engagement, volunteerism, and collective responsibility. This initiative serves as a model for future projects, demonstrating the potential for educational institutions to drive positive social change.





Social inclusiveness of the program:




PROPOSAL FOR ADOPTING ATTAPADI OORU


