



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• The event strengthens bonds among participants, fostering a sense of national unity and solidarity.


The event raises awareness about the sacrifices made by the armed forces, promoting appreciation and respect.

SESSION-2



This session concluded with the interaction session by the students and resource person. Ninety above students from the college participated in this session.



Session 2




